The adventure continues through Zambia, visiting Lusaka's elephant sanctuary, enjoying a sunset cruise on the Kafue River, and exploring the cultural heritage of the Tonga tribe in Choma.

Every detail of this Rovos Rail experience is designed for the discerning traveler. Onboard, gourmet meals are served in elegant dining cars, complemented by fine South African wines. Lectures by an onboard historian enrich your understanding of the regions you traverse, while the lounge and observation cars offer panoramic views of the ever-changing scenery. This epic journey culminates at the awe-inspiring Victoria Falls, where the Zambezi River plunges into a chasm, creating one of the world's most spectacular natural wonders. The Copper Trail is an unparalleled opportunity to explore the heart of Africa in the utmost luxury and comfort, leaving you with indelible memories of an unforgettable continent.

Your Itinerary

DAY 1

LOBITO / BENGUELA PROVINCE / HUAMBO PROVINCE

You step onto the train in Lobito, the salty Atlantic air still clinging to your clothes. The polished wood of the carriage, the soft hum of anticipation – it's a world away from the bustling port. As the train eases into motion, the Angolan coastline slips past your window, a blur of green and blue. You find your suite, a haven of quiet luxury, and feel the gentle sway of the rails begin to tell its story.

Later, over a formal dinner, the clinking of glasses and hushed conversations fill the dining car. Outside, the Benguela province unfolds under a darkening sky. You're not just moving through space; you're moving through time, leaving the known behind for the vast, unfolding narrative of Africa. The journey has truly begun.

DAY 2

HUAMBO / BOAS AGUS / KUITO

You wake to the rhythmic rumble of the train, sunlight filtering through your window. Huambo reveals itself as a city of quiet resilience, its wide avenues and colonial architecture whispering tales of old kingdoms. Walking its streets, you feel a connection to the historical heart of Angola, a place of profound significance.

Back on board, the landscape outside transforms, giving way to the vast, green expanse of Angola's central plateau. You sip tea in the observation car, watching small villages and lone figures pass by. The world outside feels immense, yet your carriage is a cozy cocoon, carrying you deeper into the continent's embrace.

DAY 3

KUITO / SAVINGUILA / LUENA

A morning stroll through Kuito feels like stepping into a living history book. The town, nestled in the heart of the Ovimbundu kingdom, carries the weight of its past with quiet dignity. You notice the textures of the buildings, the rhythm of daily life, and the enduring spirit of its people.

As the train pulls away, you reflect on the stories told by the land. The journey eastwards towards Luena is a passage through changing scenery, from open plains to more wooded areas. The sun dips low, painting the sky with fiery hues, and you feel the vastness of Angola stretching out before you, an endless horizon of discovery.

DAY 4

LUENA / GAMEIA / LUAU / CASSAI RIVER

Luena reveals a more recent chapter of Angolan history, a narrative of resilience and change. Your walking tour provides a nuanced perspective, connecting you to the contemporary pulse of the region. The air carries the scent of damp earth and distant woodsmoke, a reminder of the raw beauty of the land.

Later, the train glides beside the Cassai River, a ribbon of life winding through a massive eco-region. You might spot local fishermen, their boats mere specks against the wide expanse. As evening falls, you adjust your watch, a small gesture that marks your passage not just across borders, but into a new rhythm of time, deep in the heart of Africa.

DAY 5

DRC / MALONGA / KASAJI

Today is a day of quiet contemplation, the landscape outside a blur of green and red earth. Border formalities unfold with a gentle efficiency, a reminder of the meticulous planning behind this grand journey. You might read, write, or simply gaze out the window, letting the vastness of the DRC wash over you.

The evening brings a festive 'Africa' theme to dinner. The vibrant colors and patterns of fellow travelers' attire fill the dining car, a celebration of the continent you are traversing. Laughter and stories mingle, creating a warm counterpoint to the wild beauty passing by in the twilight.

DAY 6

MUNGULUNGA / MUTSHATSHA / KOLWEZI

The train glides through the heart of the DRC today, a continuous canvas of dense bush and remote settlements. The rhythm of the rails becomes a comforting pulse, a soundtrack to your journey. You find yourself lost in thought, the ever-changing light outside playing tricks with the shadows in your suite.

Afternoon tea offers a moment of quiet indulgence, the clink of porcelain against the backdrop of the passing wilderness. The expectation of tomorrow's copper mine visit builds, adding a layer of anticipation to the tranquil evening. The formal dinner, a ritual of elegance, rounds off another day of deep continental passage.

DAY 7

KOLWEZI / KATEBI LODGE / TENKE / SOFUMWANGO

The morning air in Kolwezi is thick with the promise of discovery. Disembarking, you feel the gritty earth underfoot as you head to the copper mine, a stark and powerful testament to human ingenuity and the earth's bounty. The scale of the operation is immense, a visceral experience that connects you to the global economy.

After the raw power of the mine, brunch at Katebi Lodge offers a serene contrast, a moment of lush tranquility. Back on the train, the day's impressions settle in. You watch the sun set over the Congolese landscape, the deep red earth mirroring the copper you've seen, carrying the weight of this unique experience with you.

DAY 8

LUBUMBASHI / MUSHOSHI / SAKANIA / NDOLA

Lubumbashi pulses with an energy unique to Central Africa. Your city drive offers a kaleidoscope of sights and sounds – bustling markets, grand buildings, and the vibrant flow of daily life. It's a sensory overload, a vivid reminder of the diverse human stories that animate this continent.

As the train makes its way towards the Zambian border, a new anticipation builds. The instructions for your South Luangwa safari shift your focus to the wild. You pack a small bag, the thought of open vehicles and starlit nights in the bush a thrilling contrast to the luxury of the train. The world outside beckons with its untamed beauty.

NDOLA / SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK / LUANGWA VALLEY

The transition from train to plane, and then to the wild, is swift and exhilarating. As your small charter plane descends towards South Luangwa, the vastness of the park stretches beneath you, a mosaic of green and brown. The air, when you step off the plane, is warm and carries the scent of dry grass and distant dust.

Your first game drive in the Luangwa Valley is an immersion. The engine of the open vehicle hums quietly, and the guide's voice is a low murmur as you spot your first impala, then an elephant, a giant against the setting sun. The light softens, painting the landscape in hues of gold and amber, and you feel utterly, completely present in this wild, ancient place.

The morning chill bites as you set out on your early game drive, the air crisp and alive with the sounds of the bush awakening. You hold your breath as a leopard might slink through the tall grass, or a herd of elephants silently cross your path. Every rustle, every distant call, sharpens your senses.

After a leisurely afternoon, the golden light of late afternoon draws you back into the wilderness. The air is softer now, warmer, and the animals are more active. As darkness descends, the spotlight picks out the glowing eyes of nocturnal creatures, transforming the familiar landscape into a mysterious new world. This is the heartbeat of Africa, raw and magnificent.

SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK

Another dawn in the bush brings new possibilities. The cool air on your face, the scent of wild sage, the anticipation of what lies around the next bend – it's a rhythm that has become familiar, yet never loses its thrill. You might witness a dramatic interaction between animals, or simply marvel at the quiet grace of a giraffe grazing.

The afternoon game drive feels like a farewell to this incredible wilderness. The setting sun casts long shadows, highlighting the unique textures of the landscape. You carry with you the images of vast plains, powerful predators, and the profound silence of the African bush, a deep connection forged with the wild heart of Zambia.

DAY 12

SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK / NDOLA / KAPIRI MPOSHI / NGWERERE

The final morning in South Luangwa offers a bittersweet game drive, a last chance to breathe in the wild air. You say goodbye to the lodge staff, their warmth lingering as you transfer to the small plane. The aerial view of the park, a vast, untamed expanse, is a stunning parting image.

Rejoining the Rovos Rail train in Ndola feels like returning to a familiar, elegant home. The clinking of silver, the crisp linen of the dining car, and the gentle rocking of the carriage are a welcome comfort after the intensity of the bush. As the train rolls towards Ngwerere, you settle back into the rhythm of luxurious rail travel, carrying the wild heart of Luangwa with you.

DAY 13

LUSAKA / KAFUE NATIONAL PARK / KAFUE RIVER

In Lusaka, the elephant sanctuary is a place of profound hope. Watching the orphaned elephants, so vulnerable yet so resilient, touches something deep within you. Their journey back to the wild is a powerful testament to compassion and conservation, a truly moving experience.

Later, the Kafue River cruise unfolds with a tranquil beauty. The setting sun paints the water in hues of orange and purple, and the gentle lapping of the water against the boat is the only sound. You sip a cool drink, watching hippos emerge and birds glide by, feeling the peaceful pulse of the Zambian wilderness.

DAY 14

KAFUE RAILWAY BRIDGE / CHOMA / MAKOLI / LIVINGSTONE

Crossing the Kafue railway bridge, you feel the sheer scale of human ambition against the vastness of the river below. The steel girders hum, a symphony of engineering that carries you onward. In Choma, the museum offers a window into the rich cultural tapestry of the Tonga tribe, their history and artistry speaking volumes.

The evening brings a charming '1920s' theme to dinner, a playful nod to a bygone era. The train chugs towards Makoli, the anticipation of Victoria Falls now a palpable excitement. You find yourself reflecting on the incredible diversity of experiences this journey has offered, from wild plains to bustling towns, all connected by the rails.

LIVINGSTONE / VICTORIA FALLS BRIDGE / VICTORIA FALLS STATION

The final morning on the train is filled with a unique blend of excitement and nostalgia. You enjoy breakfast as the train pulls into Livingstone, the air thick with anticipation. Then, the moment arrives: crossing the Victoria Falls Bridge. The spray of the Falls is a distant mist, then a roaring cloud, and you feel the thunder in your chest before you even see the full spectacle.

Arriving at Victoria Falls Station, the journey culminates in a grand finale. The memories of the vast landscapes, the vibrant cultures, and the unparalleled luxury of Rovos Rail settle within you. You step off the train, the sound of the 'Smoke that Thunders' a powerful welcome, carrying with you a transformed perspective of Africa, a continent now deeply etched in your soul.

Tips & Travel Guide

Check-in Information

Guests are required to check in a minimum of one hour before departure. If you wish to visit the Rovos Rail museum or partake in a site tour at the Pretoria Station, it is recommended to arrive two hours prior to departure. For arrivals in Pretoria, delaying your pick-up allows time for the site tour. Passports are mandatory for check-in; no vouchers are required. Luggage will be tagged and placed directly in your suite, where a full itinerary pack awaits. For Lobito, check-in is at the Hotel Terminus, R. Robert Williams 16, Lobito.

Dining Schedule

Meals on board are served in a single sitting in the dining cars, accompanied by a selection of fine South African wines. Breakfast is served from **07:00** to **10:00**, lunch at **13:00**, and tea at **16:30**. Formal dinner commences at **19:30**. Bar service is available from **07:00** until **01:00**. A gong heralds lunch and dinner.

Dress Code

Days on board require smart casual attire – neat, conventional, yet relatively informal, combining casual and formal pieces. For **dinner on board**, the dress code is formal. Gentlemen are required to wear a jacket and tie (mandatory from 2024), while ladies are suggested to wear cocktail/evening dresses or suits. Long journeys often feature themed evenings (e.g., 'Africa' or '1920s' themes), where guests can dress accordingly or opt for smart casual. For **off-train excursions**, comfortable walking shoes, sun lotion, and hats are recommended. Blankets and rain capes are available. **Game drives** are conducted in open vehicles, so dress for varying temperatures: mornings can be cool, warming up considerably, while afternoons can be warm, then cool down considerably.

Electricity & Connectivity

Suites are equipped with 220V AC 50Hz 3-point round-pronged wall plugs and 110V/220V 2-pin plugs for shavers and chargers. USB ports are also available in each suite. International adaptors can be provided. A generator supplies power, though be aware that certain power breaks are necessary for servicing. To maintain the spirit of train travel, there are no radios or television sets on board. The use of mobile phones and laptops is confined to the privacy of your suites. Mobile reception is generally poor while the train is moving. Wi-Fi is available at Rovos Rail lounges in Cape Town and Pretoria, and at most off-train accommodation, though not always guaranteed.

Climate & Weather

Temperatures vary significantly along the route and by season. For game drives, warm clothing, hats, comfortable shoes, and sun protection are advised. Rain capes are available. Consult the detailed 'Average Temps °C' table on page 8 of the brochure for specific monthly temperature ranges for each area visited.

Onboard Amenities

Each suite receives a complete amenity bag with South African biodegradable/recyclable products, including soap (40g), bamboo tissues, shampoo (50ml), hand and body wash (50ml), hand and body lotion (50ml), lip balm (15ml/7g), insect repellent spray (100ml for journeys over 4 days), reusable bamboo rounds, bamboo ear buds, and a compostable shower cap. Plug-in hairdryers are available on board, alongside sun cream, shoe mitts, nail files, sewing kits, ear plugs,

available. There is a small gift shop on the train and at Rovos Rail Station in Pretoria. Dressing gowns and slippers are provided for use on board, with gowns available for purchase.

Medical Information

Guests are responsible for ensuring they are capable of undertaking all tours and activities. Please inform Rovos Rail of any medical conditions, physical disabilities, or allergies at the time of reservation. A doctor is on board for the African Trilogy, Copper Trail, and Dar es Salaam journeys. Anti-malarial precautions are recommended, as malaria areas include eSwatini, Kruger Park, Northern Botswana, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Etosha, Tanzania, DRC, and Angola.

Recommended (but not required) immunizations include Hepatitis A & B, Polio, Tetanus, and Cholera (low risk). Ebola is confined to the northeast of DRC, thousands of miles from the Lobito journeys. A Yellow Fever/Medical Exemption Certificate is essential for travel to/from DRC and Angola; guests returning from the trip may also require it for their home country. Consult your clinic or doctor; Travel Doctor Africa can be reached at 0861 300 911 (local) or +27 (0) 11 214 9030 (international).

Luggage

Luggage can be stored in your suite under the bed or on a luggage rack above the door. While there are no strict restrictions, more than two large suitcases are not recommended. For selected long journeys, a Rovos Rail tog bag is provided for overnight trips or hand luggage on aircraft. A soft bag is preferable for plane transfers, which may have a 15kg weight restriction.

Currency

In South Africa, only Rands are accepted, and major credit cards are taken. Outside South Africa, Rands are accepted in Namibia and eSwatini. US Dollars are accepted in Zimbabwe, Tanzania (Dar es Salaam only), DRC, and Angola. Cash is highly recommended, and hotels/major dealers often accept credit cards. US Dollars printed before 2013 or worn notes will not be accepted. Low denominations are recommended for shopping/gratuities, while larger denominations are better for exchanging to local currency (especially in Tanzania).

Locomotion

Diesel or electric locomotives are primarily used. Steam locomotives are used exclusively in and around the Rovos Rail Station in Pretoria.

The Track

The railway track can be inconsistently maintained. The train travels at a maximum of 60km/h (37mph), reducing to 20km/h (12mph) on rough sections. Earplugs are available in your amenities bag and at the Gift Shop if you find the noise disruptive.

Water

Water is carried in tanks under each coach and refilled daily. Guests are encouraged to use water responsibly. Water in the suites is filtered and chlorinated, safe for bathing and brushing teeth. Bottled water is provided for drinking in biodegradable, plant-based bottles.

Children

Children are accommodated, but parents are kindly asked to be sensitive to the adult atmosphere of the train. Long journeys are not recommended for children under 13, and children aged 0-2 years are not permitted to travel. No child-minding facilities or activities are available.

Pets

Pets and emotional-support animals are not permitted on board.

Stamps are available for sale from the Gift Shop, and postcards can be handed to the Administration Deputy for posting.

Security

An electronic safe is provided in the cupboard in each suite. Guests are encouraged to close shutters or shutters and windows when not in their suites, especially when passing through stations. Train doors in the passages are locked from the inside, and your suite door can also be locked.

Service

A dedicated host/ess is available 24 hours a day and can be reached via your suite telephone. Suites are cleaned daily, with a nightly turndown service. The Train Manager and Deputy Train Manager are available for queries, and the Administration Deputy is based in the Gift Shop for administrative requirements.

Smoking

Smoking is permitted only in the smoking Club Lounge. Guests are requested to be mindful of others. It is strictly forbidden to throw flammable items off the train due to the risk of bush fires. Guests should note at the time of reservation if they are smoking or non-smoking to assist with appropriate room requests at hotels/lodges.

Special Occasions

Guests celebrating a special occasion should inform Rovos Rail at the time of reservation so they can help make it memorable.

Terms & Conditions

Payment Terms

25% of total tour cost due at the time of booking. 75% balance due no later than 65 days prior to tour departure date. All reservations are subject to availability and will be confirmed upon receipt of the required deposit. A provisional booking will be held for 14 days, after which the 25% deposit is due.

Change of Date / Name / Occupancy

Changes may be requested up to 125 days prior to departure and are subject to availability and supplier approval. No changes will be permitted within 65 days prior to departure. Any request within this period will be treated as a cancellation and subject to the applicable cancellation fees. All changes may incur additional costs, which will be advised prior to confirmation. No changes will be processed without written authorization and payment of any applicable fees.

Payments may be made via bank transfer or credit card. All payments must reference the booking number and be supported by proof of payment. Refunds, when applicable, will be processed to the original form of payment. Any exchange rate fluctuations or bank charges are the responsibility of the client.

This tour passes through South Africa and Namibia; please confirm visa requirements for your nationality well in advance.

Health & Medical

Guests are solely responsible for ensuring they are capable of undertaking the tours and activities. Please inform us at the time of booking if you have any medical conditions, physical disabilities, or allergies. Anti-malarial precautions are recommended for certain areas visited on this itinerary, including Etosha National Park. Please consult your clinic or doctor for the latest medical advice prior to travel.
