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# Overview

Your adventure begins in Pretoria, where you'll settle into the luxurious comfort of your Rovos Rail suite before heading south across the Witwatersrand goldfields. The first major stop is Kimberley, a city forged in the diamond rush of 1871, where you'll explore the Diamond Mine Museum and the iconic Big Hole. The train then journeys through the starkly beautiful Karoo, a geological marvel that was once an inland sea.

Crossing into Namibia, the tour delves into the country's unique natural wonders. Experience the Orange River with a sundowner cruise in Upington, then marvel at the colossal Fish River Canyon, the second largest canyon in the world. Discover the eerie beauty of Kolmanskop, a ghost town swallowed by desert sands, and the coastal charm of Lüderitz, known for its colonial architecture and diverse wildlife. In Keetmanshoop, you'll encounter the ancient Quiver Trees of Garas Park, a striking photographic opportunity.

A highlight is the overnight excursion to Sossusvlei, where you'll fly into the heart of the Namib Desert for an afternoon drive among its ancient, iron-oxide-rich red dunes, culminating in a bush dinner under the stars. The journey continues to Windhoek, Namibia's capital, for a city tour that reveals its German colonial heritage and vibrant modern life. Later, immerse yourself in conservation efforts at the Cheetah Conservation Project in Otjiwarongo, supporting the vital work of saving cheetahs in the wild.

The safari culminates with an unforgettable two-night stay at a lodge in Etosha National Park, renowned for its abundant wildlife and the vast Etosha pan, a 'Great White Place' for game viewing. Enjoy thrilling game drives at dawn and dusk, witnessing a spectacular array of mammals, birds, and reptiles. Finally, the train traverses the ancient Namib Desert, delivering you to Walvis Bay, where your luxurious rail odyssey concludes, leaving you with indelible memories of Africa's wild heart and its most opulent train.

# Your Itinerary

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## DAY 1

### PRETORIA

The whistle sounds, a deep, resonant call, and the train glides from Pretoria, pulling you gently into the landscape. You watch the gold-rich hills of Witwatersrand blur past, a silent testament to history, as you settle into your suite. The scent of polished wood and fine linen surrounds you, a promise of the luxury to come. You feel the subtle sway of the carriage, a rhythm that begins to untangle the knots of everyday life.

Later, over a perfectly crafted dinner, the clink of crystal and the murmur of conversation create a convivial atmosphere. 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## DAY 2

### KIMBERLEY / DE AAR

The scale of it makes you feel small, yet connected to the fortunes and dreams that shaped this land. Later, the train carries you into the Karoo, a landscape of profound silence and ancient geology. The vastness outside, a canvas of subtle ochres and greens, feels like a deep breath.

The observation car becomes your moving gallery, framing the endless horizons. You watch the light shift, painting the distant hills in hues of lavender and gold. There's a quiet understanding that settles in, a sense of being part of something immense and timeless. Dinner, a formal affair, feels earned after a day of discovery, a shared moment of reflection as the train continues its gentle journey into the night.





### DAY 3

## UPINGTON / NAKOP / ARIAMSVLEI

The Orange River flows wide and slow, reflecting the late afternoon sun as you embark on a sundowner cruise. The air cools, carrying the scent of river reeds, and the sky transforms into a fiery canvas of oranges and purples. You hold a glass, the ice clinking softly, feeling a peaceful quiet settle over the group as the day ends in a spectacular display of nature.

Later, back on the train, the energy shifts to an 'Africa' themed dinner. There's a buzz of anticipation for the border formalities, a tangible crossing into the next chapter of your journey. You sense the vastness of the continent ahead, an adventure unfolding with every mile of track.

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### DAY 4

## AUS

The sheer scale of the Fish River Canyon takes your breath away. You stand at the edge, gazing into a chasm carved by time, feeling the ancient power of the earth. The silence here is profound, vast and humbling, a stark contrast to the gentle rumble of the train. The light plays across the rock formations, revealing layers of deep reds and browns, each telling a story millions of years old.

As the train continues its journey, you carry the image of the canyon's grandeur with you. The desert outside becomes more than just sand and rock; it's a living canvas of resilience. Dinner, later, feels like a warm embrace after witnessing such raw, elemental beauty, a moment to share awe with fellow travelers.

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### DAY 5

## KOLMANSKOP / LÜDERITZ / KEETMANSHOOP

The silence is broken only by the crunch of sand beneath your feet, a poignant echo of a bygone era. As the train pulls away, heading towards Keetmanshoop, you gaze out at the vast, empty expanse, pondering the resilience of both nature and human spirit. The observation car, now at the front, offers an unobstructed view of the track ahead, a metaphor for the journey itself. Dinner becomes a time for quiet reflection on the day's haunting beauty.

## DAY 6

### KEETMANSHOOP / MARIENTAL / REHOBOTH

The Quiver Trees stand like ancient sentinels in Garas Park, their gnarled branches reaching towards the sky in a timeless dance. You feel a sense of wonder at their resilience, standing tall against the harsh desert elements, each tree a living sculpture. The sun casts long shadows, perfect for capturing their unique forms, a moment of quiet contemplation.

As the train continues its journey, the landscape shifts again, a subtle change in texture and color. You find yourself gazing out the window, lost in thought, the rhythmic clickety-clack of the wheels a soothing soundtrack. Dinner brings a renewed sense of camaraderie, sharing stories and photographs of the day's natural artistry.

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## DAY 7

### SOSSUSVLEI

The light aircraft hums, carrying you over an endless tapestry of red. You look down at the Namib Desert, a vast, ancient sea of sand stretching to the horizon, and feel a thrill of anticipation. Landing at Sossusvlei, the air is dry and warm, carrying the scent of dust and distant scrub. The sheer scale of the dunes, sculpted by millions of years of wind, is breathtaking. You feel a profound sense of isolation and wonder.

As the sun dips, painting the dunes in fiery hues, you embark on a desert drive. The silence is immense, punctuated only by the crunch of tires on sand. 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## DAY 8

### SOSSUSVLEI / WINDHOEK / KRANZBERG

The desert wakes with you, the cool morning air crisp and clear as you embark on a final drive. Breakfast in the vlei, surrounded by towering dunes, feels like a dream. You watch the sun climb, illuminating the red sands in ever-changing light, a final, lingering image of this ancient landscape before your flight to the city.

Windhoek greets you with a different energy, a bustling capital nestled among mountains. The city tour reveals layers of history and culture, from colonial architecture to vibrant craft markets. It's a fascinating shift from the raw wilderness, a reminder of Namibia's diverse identity. As the train pulls away in the evening, you feel the contrast of the day, carrying the wild silence and urban buzz within you.

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## OTJIWARONGO / OTAVI

The cheetahs move with an effortless grace, their amber eyes holding a wild intelligence. You learn about the dedicated conservationists working tirelessly to protect these magnificent creatures, feeling a deep respect for their mission. The experience is intimate, a powerful connection to the struggle and triumph of wildlife preservation in Africa. It's a reminder of the delicate balance between humanity and nature.

As the train departs Otjiwarongo, a sense of purpose lingers. The formal dinner feels like a celebration of the day's insights, a chance to reflect on the importance of such conservation efforts. The landscape outside is now a backdrop to the powerful images of the cheetahs, imprinting their beauty onto your memory.

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## ETOSHA

The open vehicle bumps along dusty tracks, the air thick with the scent of acacia and dry earth. You scan the horizon, heart thrumming with anticipation, and then, there they are: a herd of elephants, silent giants moving through the savanna. The light of the late afternoon bathes the landscape in a golden glow, highlighting the stripes of a zebra, the elegant neck of a giraffe. Every rustle in the bush, every distant call, sharpens your senses.

Dinner at the lodge, under a vast African sky, feels like a culmination of the day's wild magic. The air is cool, the sounds of the night beginning to stir. You recount sightings with fellow travelers, the day's adventures vivid in your mind, feeling deeply connected to the primal beauty of Etosha, ready for another dawn in the wilderness.

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## ETOSHA / TSUMEB

The morning game drive is crisp, the air cool, carrying the promise of new sightings. You watch a lioness stalk through the tall grass, a moment of primal focus, before the sun climbs higher. Leaving Etosha, a part of you lingers in the wild, but the return to the train brings a different kind of comfort, the familiar luxury a welcome transition.

As the train pulls away from Tsumeb, you feel the gentle sway and the steady rhythm of the rails once more. The '1920s' themed dinner is a delightful change of pace, a chance to step back in time, sharing laughter and stories. You gaze out at the darkening landscape, knowing that tomorrow, the Atlantic awaits, marking the close of this extraordinary chapter.

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## WALVIS BAY

The train slows, and you catch the first glimpse of the Atlantic, a shimmering line where the ancient Namib Desert meets the vast ocean. The air changes, carrying the distinct scent of salt and sea, a crisp contrast to the desert's dry heat. You watch the landscape transform, from endless dunes to the bustling port of Walvis Bay, a profound sense of accomplishment settling over you.

As you disembark, the journey's end feels like a new beginning. You carry with you the vibrant colors of Namibia, the roars of Etosha, the haunting silence of Kolmanskop, and the luxurious comfort of the train. The memories are not just images, but a feeling, a deep connection to a continent explored in unparalleled style.

# Tips & Travel Guide

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## Check-in Information

For your Rovos Rail Namibia Safari, please check-in a minimum of one hour before departure. If you wish to visit the Rovos Rail museum or take a site tour at Rovos Rail Station in Pretoria, it's recommended to arrive two hours prior to departure. Your check-in location in Pretoria is Rovos Rail Station, 1 Transnet Avenue, Capital Park. Passports are required at check-in; no vouchers are needed. Your luggage will be tagged and placed directly in your suite, where you'll also find a full itinerary pack.

## Dining Schedule

Meals on board Rovos Rail are served in one sitting only within the elegant dining cars. Breakfast is available from **07:00 to 10:00**, lunch is served promptly at **13:00**, and tea is offered at **16:30**. Dinner is a formal affair, commencing at **19:30**. A gentle gong heralds the serving of lunch and dinner. The bar service operates from **07:00** until approximately **01:00**.

## Dress Code

During the day on board the train, the dress code is smart casual – neat, conventional, yet relatively informal clothing pieces. For dinner, the dress code is formal: gentlemen are required to wear a collar and tie (a jacket is optional), while ladies are encouraged to wear cocktail/evening dresses or suits. The Namibia Safari includes themed evenings ('Africa' and '1920s') where guests can dress up accordingly or opt for smart casual. For off-train excursions, comfortable walking shoes, sun lotion, and hats are recommended. Game drives in open vehicles suggest dressing in layers, as mornings can be cool, warming up considerably, and afternoons can cool down again.

## Electricity & Connectivity

Each suite is equipped with 220V AC 50Hz 3-point round-pronged wall plugs, along with 110V/220V 2-pin plugs for shavers and chargers. USB ports are also available in each suite. International adaptors are provided if needed. The train's power is supplied by a generator, and while generally reliable, certain breaks in power are necessary for servicing. In keeping with the spirit of train travel, there is no radio, television, or WiFi on board the train. The use of mobile phones and laptops is confined to the privacy of your suites. WiFi is available at Rovos Rail lounges in Cape Town and Pretoria, and at most off-train accommodation, though not always guaranteed.

## Climate & Weather

The journey traverses diverse regions, experiencing various climates. For example, Walvis Bay averages 16-22°C in Jan/Feb, while Etosha Pan ranges 18-31°C in Jan/Feb. September/October sees temperatures in Etosha rise to 15-32°C. Mornings on game drives can be cool, warming up considerably, and afternoons can be warm before cooling down. Warm clothing, hats, comfortable shoes, and sun protection are advised. Rain capes are available.

## Onboard Amenities

Your suite includes a range of South African biodegradable and/or recyclable products: soap (40g), bamboo tissues, shampoo (50ml), hand and body wash (50ml), hand and body lotion (50ml), lip balm (15ml), insect repellent spray (for journeys over 4 days), reusable bamboo rounds, bamboo ear buds, a compostable shower cap, ear plugs, sun cream, razors, and nail files. Plug-in hairdryers are available in your bathroom unit or upon request. Comfortable one-size-fits-

all dressing gowns and slippers are provided for use on board, with the option to purchase them from the Gift Shop. A limited laundry service (10 items per day) is available, with a 48-hour turnaround; no dry-cleaning facilities are offered.

## Medical Information

All guests are solely responsible for ensuring they are capable of undertaking the tours and activities. Please inform Rovos Rail at the time of your reservation if you have any medical conditions, physical disabilities, or allergies. While there is no doctor permanently on this specific journey, the train is equipped with a standard medical kit, oxygen, an automated external defibrillator, and a wheelchair. Anti-malarial precautions are recommended for areas like Etosha. Recommended immunisations include Hepatitis A + B, Polio, Tetanus, and Cholera (low risk). A Yellow Fever/Medical Exemption Certificate is essential if traveling to/from DRC and Angola. Please consult your clinic or doctor before travel. For urgent medical advice, you can contact Travel Doctor Africa at local 0861 300 911 or international +27 (0) 11 214 9030.

## Luggage

Luggage can be stored in your suite under the bed or above the door on a luggage rack. While there are no strict restrictions on board, carrying more than two large suitcases is not recommended. For overnight trips or plane transfers, a Rovos Rail tog bag is provided, and a soft bag is preferable for flights with a weight restriction of 15kg.


## Currency

In South Africa, only Rands are accepted, and major credit cards are taken on the train. Outside South Africa (Namibia, eSwatini, Zimbabwe, Tanzania, DRC, Angola), Rands are accepted, but US Dollars are widely accepted and cash is highly recommended. Hotels and major dealers typically accept credit cards. Be aware that US Dollar notes printed before 2013 or those that appear worn will not be accepted. Low denominations are recommended for shopping and gratuities, while larger denominations are useful for exchanging to local currency, especially in Tanzania.

25% of total tour cost due at the time of booking. 75% balance due no later than 65 days prior to tour departure date. All reservations are subject to availability and will be confirmed upon receipt of the required deposit. A provisional booking will be held for 14 days, after which the 25% deposit is due.
