Eminence Galapagos Luxury Cruise – 3 Nights, Itinerary D (Wednesday to Saturday)

3 Nights • Luxury Experience

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Overview

This 3-night Itinerary D sails Wednesday to Saturday aboard the M/C Eminence and visits San Cristobal, Espanola, Floreana and Santa Cruz. Fares start at US\$6,490 per person in a double cabin, with departures listed below through 2028. The pick for guests who want the newest hardware in the islands: elevator, spa, gym and the only private-jacuzzi suites in the fleet.

The M/C Eminence is the newest and largest catamaran in this fleet, taking its first guests in April 2027. It carries 16 guests in nine suites: five Golden Suites with enlarged private balconies, two Panorama Suites with their own lounge, terrace and personal jacuzzi, and two Lofts on the upper level. A panoramic elevator links the main deck to the sky deck, which is rare on a yacht of this size and makes the boat a sensible choice for guests with limited mobility.

Four decks give plenty of room to spread out: suites and a briefing lounge on the main deck, the Panorama Suites and a spa on the upper deck, an al-fresco bar, dining area and outdoor jacuzzi on the sky deck, and a gym with an infrared sauna on the top moon deck. Solar panels, water-reuse systems and full wastewater treatment are built in, and the vessel is committed to certified carbon neutrality within its first year.

Excursions are led by licensed Galapagos National Park naturalist guides in groups of no more than eight. Snorkelling equipment, wetsuits, kayaks and paddle boards are included.

Your Itinerary

DAY 1

DAY 1 - WEDNESDAY: SAN CRISTOBAL

SAN CRISTOBAL ISLAND: Kicker Rock - Lobos Island Upon arrival, reception and assistance at the airport, followed by transfer to M/C Eminence. In the afternoon, navigation starts toward Kicker Rock, a striking volcanic formation rising from the ocean. This site is known for its rich marine life and clear waters, offering excellent conditions for snorkeling. Guests may observe sea turtles, rays, reef fish, and occasionally sharks moving through the channel formed by the rock.

Activities: Circumnavigation

Type of landing: No landing

Difficulty: Moderate

Later, visit to Lobos Island, located off the coast of San Cristobal. This small island offers a relaxed introduction to the Galapagos, with a sandy trail surrounded by coastal vegetation and

wildlife. Sea lions are commonly seen resting along the shore, while blue footed boobies and frigatebirds nest nearby. The calm surroundings make it an ideal first contact with the islands' natural rhythm.

Activities: Walking, kayaking/stand up paddleboarding, Dinghy ride

Type of landing: Wet landing

Difficulty: Moderate

Meals on board: lunch, dinner

DAY 2 - THURSDAY: ESPANOLA

ESPANOLA ISLAND: Suarez Point - Gardner Bay / Gardner and Osborn Islet In the morning, visit to Suarez Point, one of the most important wildlife areas in the Galapagos. The trail crosses a landscape of lava and coastal cliffs where marine iguanas gather in large groups. Along the way, Nazca boobies and blue footed boobies can be seen nesting, and during the season, waved albatross may also be observed. The cliffs offer impressive ocean views, where waves crash against the rocks creating a natural blowhole.

Activities: Walking

Type of landing: Dry landing

Difficulty: Moderate

In the afternoon, visit to Gardner Bay, a wide white sand beach on Espanola Island. Sea lions rest along the shore, and the calm waters are ideal for snorkeling. Near Osborn Islet, guests may encounter rays, sea turtles, and a variety of reef fish. This visit offers a quieter and scenic contrast to the morning exploration.

Activities: Walking, snorkeling, kayaking/stand up paddleboarding, Dinghy ride

Type of landing: Wet landing

Difficulty: Easy

Meals on board: breakfast, lunch, dinner

DAY 3 - FRIDAY: FLOREANA

FLOREANA ISLAND: Baroness Viewpoint - Post Office Bay / Punta Cormorant - Champion Islet In the morning, visit Baroness Viewpoint, a scenic site overlooking the coastline and connected to the human stories of the island's early settlers. Continue to nearby Post Office Bay, a historic location where travelers have exchanged letters since the 18th century through a wooden barrel. Guests may take part in this tradition by leaving or collecting postcards.

Activities: Walking, snorkeling, kayaking/stand up paddleboarding, Dinghy ride

Type of landing: Wet landing

Difficulty: Easy

In the afternoon, visit to Punta Cormorant, known for its green colored beach formed by mineral deposits. A nearby lagoon often hosts flamingos and other bird species. A short trail leads to a second beach where sea turtles may nest. Offshore, Champion Islet offers excellent snorkeling conditions, with chances to observe sea lions, rays, reef sharks, and schools of fish.

Activities: Walking, snorkeling, kayaking/stand up paddleboarding, Dinghy ride

Type of landing: Wet landing

Difficulty: Moderate

Meals on board: breakfast, lunch, dinner

DAY 4 - SATURDAY: SANTA CRUZ

SANTA CRUZ ISLAND: Highlands - BALTRA AIRPORT In the morning, visit to the highlands of Santa Cruz Island. In this lush and humid area, guests can observe giant tortoises roaming freely in their natural habitat. The landscape is greener and more open, with natural trails that allow for a peaceful final exploration. This area also offers good opportunities for birdwatching, with finches and other native species present.

Activities: Walking

Type of landing: Dry landing

Difficulty: Easy

After this last visit, transfer to Baltra Airport for your return flight to mainland Ecuador. Assistance and farewell at the airport.

Meals on board: breakfast

Terms & Conditions

Payment Policy*:

- At the time of booking a deposit of 20% of the total tour price
- The remaining balance is due a minimum of 65 calendar days prior to departure date

To issue final confirmation Palace tours requires 60 days prior to departure (or at time of reservation for last minute bookings) the following information for all passengers:

- Complete passenger names
- Passport numbers (& passport copy in case of children)
- Nationality
- Date of birth
- Marital Status
- Dietary or medical restrictions

Failure to provide the above information on time may result in delays and possibly passengers missing the tour completely. Palace tours will not accept responsibility or provide refunds if the above information is not provided in its entirety and on time.

Cancellation Policy*

All cancellations must be done in writing. If a cancellation is received more than 125 days prior to tour departure date a Cancellation fee of 10% of the total price will be retained as cancellation fee.

If a cancellation is received between 124 days and 65 days prior to tour departure date, 20% of the total price will be forfeited.

In the case of a cancellation received less than 65 days prior to the boat departure the full amount will be retained.

Frequently Asked Questions

When is the best time to visit Galapagos?

Galapagos is a place that can be visited at any time. There are two seasons, and the warmest is between December and May. It is the time of year when the sky is always clear, and the sun shines strongly. If you love to dive in amazing places, the best time to visit Galapagos is from June to November. During this season the weather is a little cooler, but it gives you the chance to enjoy the best from Galapagos' famous marine reserve.

What should we bring?

Since the islands are situated very near the Equator, we recommend that you bring lightweight clothing and of course, don't forget your swimsuits, sun lotion, and good footwear.

How long is the flight from Ecuador to the Galapagos?

It depends from where you depart. Flights to the Galapagos leave from Quito and Guayaquil. It takes about half an hour to get from Quito to Guayaquil and roughly one and a half hours from Guayaquil to the islands.

Are there any immunizations required/recommended?

For the Galapagos Islands there are no required or recommended immunizations. If you, however, intend to spend more time in Ecuador, especially in the jungle, immunization is highly recommended. As this changes from time to time please check with your local health office (or the Institute for Tropical Diseases) a few weeks in advance of your trip.

Are single or triple suites available?

Most of our cruises will assign double cabins to all passengers unless you want to pay the single supplement if traveling alone. Triple cabins can also be arranged on request, depending on availability and the vessel you choose.

What is the time zone of the Galapagos Islands?

The Galapagos Islands are 6 hours behind GMT (equivalent to USA Central Standard Time)

Does the equatorial line cross the Galapagos Islands?

The equatorial line does pass through the Galapagos, just north of Isla Santiago. Please refer to our Itinerary page to see which itinerary passes through the equatorial line.

What are marine currents like the Galapagos?

The Galapagos Islands waters have the Humboldt Current's influence that brings cold waters especially during the mist rainy season (cool weather) from July to December. The warm season is during the months of January to June. The southeast trade winds become weaker and the water from the Panama Basin remains warm. During this season there is more of a tropical climate with some occasional rains. "El Niño" current may cause a much greater flow of warm waters, making the surface warmer and rainfall increase.

What is the water temperature in the Islands?

Average water temperatures in Galapagos:

January - June: 70°F - 80°F (20°C - 26°C)

July - December: 65°F - 75°F (18°C- 23°C)

Can you snorkel in the Galapagos?

Snorkeling equipment is available on-board and is an activity on all of our Galapagos Cruises. All water sports convey a certain risk. Passengers participating in these activities do so under their own responsibility.

Special Diets:

Which islands does the Eminence Itinerary D visit?

The 3-night Itinerary D visits San Cristobal, Espanola, Floreana and Santa Cruz, sailing Wednesday to Saturday. See the day-by-day tab for the landing sites and activities on each day.

What is included in the M/C Eminence fare?

Accommodation in your suite, all meals and snacks on board, soft drinks, guided excursions with licensed National Park naturalists, snorkelling equipment and wetsuits, kayaks and paddle boards, Galapagos airport transfers and a welcome and farewell cocktail. Flights to the islands, the Galapagos National Park fee and transit card, alcoholic drinks and gratuities are extra.
